

A combination of online and independent learning.

We would like to personally invite your child to attend our DSBN Virtual Summer Learning Program this year for students currently in JK to Grade 5. The program will run from July 6 - August 14 in the morning for one hour.

When you register, you have a choice of attending for the whole 6 weeks or for the July or August, 3-week time slot. Students who register will be expected to actively engage in the learning or they may be removed from the course. Every day students will meet with a qualified teacher in D2L to work on their math and literacy skills, as well other fun and engaging activities including physical education, science, the arts and investigating Indigenous perspectives. A significant focus will be given to those areas of the

curriculum that may not have been covered due to Covid-19. In addition, there is an optional afternoon STEM program consisting of a coding camp for Grade 1 and Grade 2 students and a special app development camp for Grade 3 to Grade 5.

Students may attend only one of these sessions during the summer. Check out what weeks they will be offered.

- June 29 - July 3 App Development (Grades 3-5)
- July 6 - July 10 Coding with Lynx (Grades 1-2)
- July 13 - July 17 App Development (Grades 3-5)
- July 27 - July 31 Coding with Lynx (Grades 1-2)
- Aug. 3 - Aug. 7 Coding with Lynx (Grades 3-5)

The District School Board of Niagara encourages all students to explore a wide variety of community experiences and activities in order to develop an understanding of the various roles they can play in their community and to help them develop a greater sense of belonging within their community. As part of the Ontario secondary school diploma requirements, every student is required to complete a minimum 40 hours of community involvement. These activities may be completed at any time starting the summer before a student enters Grade 9 and after reviewing the expectations and regulations.
